A/UX 3.0 and Password Entry Error (4/93)

TOPIC -----

I'm running A/UX 3.0 and getting the following message when booting:

```
banjo: syslog: getpwnam invalid name field:
```

When I hit OK, everything seemed fine. The message has gone away for now, but I've had to cut quite a bit out of my /etc/password file.

The original /etc/password file contained 172 lines of code, but the new one contains 28 lines.

I'm planning on restoring some of the userids not in the current file, but I would like to know what might be causing these error messages. I can't locate the offending entry.

DISCUSSION -----

The "... syslog: getpwnam: invalid name field:" message will be shown on the A/UX System Console window recorded by the "syslogd" daemon if there are any blank line(s) or the name field(s) are white space(s).

Hence the blank line(s) and white space(s) field in /etc/passwd are not allowed.

We can reproduce this by inserting a blank line in the /etc/passwd file.
