## Apple Workgroup Server 95: AppleShare and NFS Server (6/93)

| TOPIC   |
| I have an environment with an equal split of Macintosh and DOS computers, with SUN's PCNFS client Software on the DOS computers. A few UNIX computers are used as NFS file servers along with a few AppleShare File servers.  |
| I need to easily share files between all platforms. I want one server that can easily serve all three environments without having to change the client's file sharing software (AppleShare, PCNFS, and NFS).  |
| Is there any technical reason that would exclude the Apple Workgroup Server (AWS) 95 as a multi-platform server in installations where AppleShare and NFS were the filesharing protocols of choice?   |
| DISCUSSION  |
| I don't see any difficulty of an AWS 95 acting as a single platform for both AppleShare and NFS servers.  |
| For PCNFS clients on PC Windows or DOS computers to access files transparently, the AWS 95 must run with "pcnfsd", a special version of NFS server for PCs. The "pcnfsd" daemon is located in the /usr/etc/pcnfsd directory which shipped with the AWS 95. You may have the pcnfsd daemon automatically run from the /etc/inittab file. |
| For Unix NFS clients to communicate with AWS 95, the AWS 95 server must be configure with "nfs" kernel via the "newconfig nfs" command. The A/UX NFS server /etc/nfsd, will be automatically run by A/UX. The AWS 95 also needs to export the mount points specified in /etc/exports. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.              |
