

## **INIT 31 Mechanism and INIT 29 Virus**

Only files in the System Folder of the type "INIT", "CDEV", or "RDEV" are searched for INITs at startup. In fact, with System 6.0.2 and later, only visible files in the System Folder are searched for INITs.

The INIT 29 virus installs an INIT in every resource file that is opened, in which a code resource is installed, excluding applications. Because the Desktop file is a resource file and not an application, an INIT is installed. This INIT is never activated. Copyright 1989 Apple Computer, Inc.
