Macintosh LC 475: Logic Board Upgrade (Discontinued)

TOPIC -----

A Macintosh LC II or Macintosh LC III can be upgraded to a Macintosh LC 475 with a logic board upgrade. The upgrade kit can also be used to upgrade a Performa 400, 405, 410, 430, 450, 460, 466, or 467.

There is no kit for upgrading a Macintosh LC to a Macintosh LC 475, but a Macintosh LC can be upgraded to a Macintosh LC III.

** IMPORTANT NOTE **

Apple discontinued this logic board upgrade in June 1995. There may be some third party resellers who still carry this logic board upgrade, but it is no longer available directly from Apple Computer, Inc. or Apple Authorized resellers.
