PowerBook 145 and 145B: Differences (6/93)

This article summarizes the differences between the PowerBook 145 and the PowerBook 145B.

DISCUSSION -----

RAM

- The PowerBook 145's 4MB configuration has 2MB RAM on the logic board and 2MB in the expansion slot. To expand RAM beyond 4MB, the user must replace the 2MB expansion card with a higher-capacity RAM card.
- The PowerBook 145B, on the other hand, comes with 4MB RAM on the logic board, allowing expansion beyond 4MB without having to first remove 2MB from the expansion slot.

Floppy Disk

Only one floppy disk is shipped with the PowerBook 145B: Disk Tools, which includes Restore software. Special backup software for the PowerBook 145B is installed on the hard drive, which customers can use to back up their System software to floppy disks.

Microphone

The microphone is optional, not included with the PowerBook 145B.
