Disk First Aid: Can't Repair Corrupted Files (7/93)

TOPIC -----

I tried Disk First Aid to find and repair a problem in a text file I was working on. It said everything was fine. Why won't it recognize the problem?

DISCUSSION -----

If Disk First Aid said the hard disk or floppy disk your file was on was fine, your problem is probably a corrupted data file (such as a word-processing file) or application.

Disk First Aid will check for and correct damage to the directories and catalog files. It cannot check individual files for corruption. The only thing to do is to replace it if you have a backup copy or recreate it, as you will probably need to do with your text file. If it is a corrupted application, reinstall from the master.
