TOPIC -----

I would like to tilt up the front of a Macintosh IIci and IIvx by 20 degrees.  
Is there risk of damage if the hard disk is used at this angle?

DISCUSSION -----

There was a time when the bearing life of hard disk drives was sensitive to physical position. Our newer drives, however, have been designed to be more tolerant of the orientation. So, there is no need to be concerned about operating the computer at a 20 degree tilt. Actually, most new drives function well in any physical orientation.
