

LaserWriter Pro 600 and 630: Differences

TOPIC -----

This article describes the differences between the LaserWriter Pro 600 and the LaserWriter Pro 630. The printers differ only in terms of RAM and ports.

DISCUSSION -----

Memory

- The LaserWriter Pro 600 has 4MB of built-in memory, and ships with a 4MB PhotoGrade Memory Kit which, after dealer installation, gives the printer 8MB of memory.
- The LaserWriter Pro 630 has 8MB of memory built in.

With 8MB of memory, both printers can use PhotoGrade at 300 dpi (dots per inch) and can print at 600 dpi.

Other Features

The LaserWriter Pro 630 has two extra features that the LaserWriter Pro 600 doesn't have.

- The 630 has a built-in Ethernet communications port that allows faster data transmission from the computer to the LaserWriter Pro 630 and may help documents print faster.
- The 630 also has internal and external SCSI ports that allow the user to attach SCSI hard disks for storage of additional fonts. Copyright 1993, Apple Computer, Inc.
