LW IIg and Pro 630: LocalTalk and EtherTalk Printer Names 6/93

TOPIC -----

Is the LaserWriter IIg, capable of storing a separate printer name for LocalTalk and EtherTalk?

DISCUSSION -----

The LaserWriter IIg, as well as the LaserWriter Pro 630 (which also has an EtherTalk port), has separate areas in NVRAM (non-volatile memory) to store a LocalTalk and an EtherTalk printer name. This functionality is provided since these printers can have all of their ports connected to simultaneously. Thus, one could assign a different name for the printer on a LocalTalk network, and on a EtherTalk network by using the LaserWriter Utility from Macintoshes on the respective networks.
